Guest Speaker Samantha Rennie - Mental Health and Covid

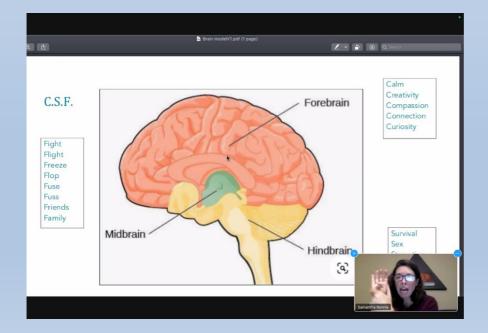


On Monday 16th August we held our Keilor East Rotary Meeting via Zoom. We can highly recommend our Guest Speaker, Samantha Rennie from Grieving Well Now. http://samantharennie.com/

We found her presentation most relevant during these challenging times and we felt her warmth and caring nature through our screens. We thank her and congratulate her upon her ability to help others through times of anxiety, depression and grief.

Samantha Rennie - from Grieving Well Now showed us a PowerPoint presentation with some graphics which she uses to help illustrate that there are only certain things we can control. Outside that Control centre we are influenced by people's actions, attitudes etc. and outside that again are areas of concern which can provide stress if, for example, we are watching the TV news. We can avoid a lot of stress simply, for example, by not getting caught up in the Covid numbers each day.





Samantha showed us the map of the human brain and stressed that trying to stay within the calming, creative, curious, compassionate and connected areas can limit the stress caused by the body's natural reaction to stress which is fight or flight.

During Covid Lockdowns we can help ourselves remain calm by connecting with people, writing, reading, researching, doing puzzles, sewing, cooking, making models etc.

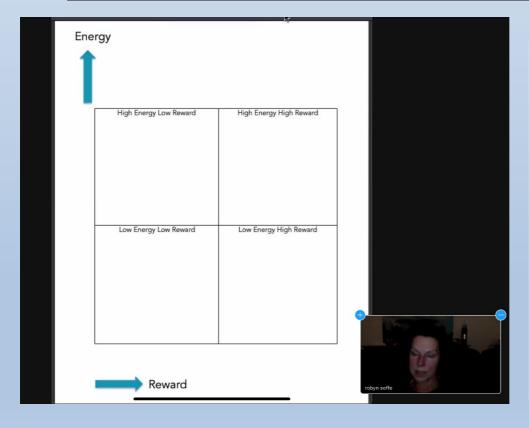

Samantha told us of how depression can be extremely limiting and that for someone who is severely depressed that getting out of bed, having a shower or drinking more water can be small steps towards regaining control.

She showed us the Energy /Reward model and indicated that if we can focus on activities in the Low Energy High Reward sector during these challenging times, we should feel less stressed.

We thoroughly enjoyed Samantha's presentation. We thank her and hope that we will be able to meet her again soon.

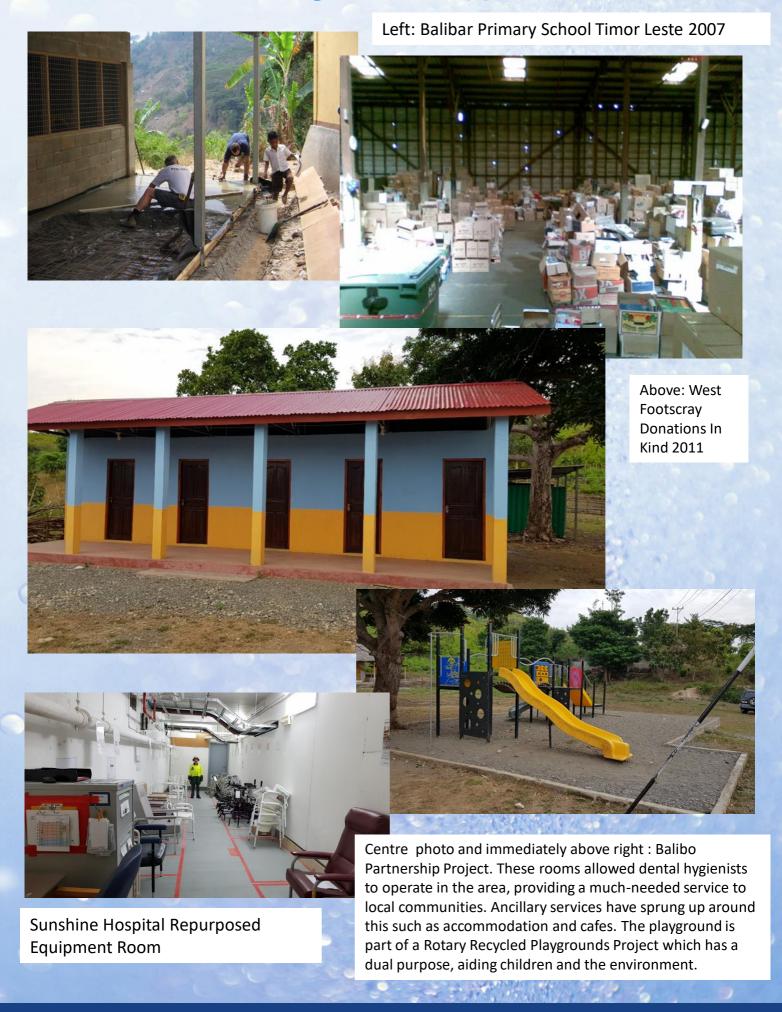
Victorian Parliamentary Hansard 4th May 2004 Rotary: Maribyrnong River project

Mr MILDENHALL (Footscray) — This morning I had the great pleasure of joining the Speaker and representatives from 14 Rotary clubs, municipalities and government agencies for the launch of a visionary project for the centenary of Rotary in 2005 called 'A river for everyone'. The aim of the project is to improve signage and provide family fun and health activities along 25 kilometres of the magnificent Maribyrnong River, from Brimbank Park to the Docklands. It includes 120 distance-marking bollards, 30 intersection bollards, 10 car park bollards and 15 comprehensive information bollards.

I would like to congratulate the Rotary clubs of Brimbank Central, Essendon, Essendon North, Flemington, Footscray, West Footscray, Maribyrnong, Highpoint, Keilor, Keilor East, Melbourne North, Moonee Valley, Sunshine, Tullamarine and Yarraville for this outstanding example of community leadership. I am sure my colleagues and I who represent the communities along the river will stand by to assist these Rotary clubs as they seek to achieve coordination among the range of government agencies and municipalities to ensure that this project can proceed and that the current fragmented signage along the area is replaced.

At last night's meeting I mentioned for some feel good distraction, as in Lock Down Two last year, the Peregrine Falcons in the CBD have commenced laying this year's clutch of eggs. I'm hoping as I'm sure you are, that's this is not like Ground Hog Day.

The first egg was laid on Saturday and the second this afternoon. Falcons usually produce between two and four eggs and don't usually seriously commence incubating until all eggs have been laid. This allows for all the chicks to hatch at about the same time and therefore not have the situation of the older and stronger chicks out competing their younger siblings for food.

Unlike last year, Mirvac have taken over the management of the site and there is no longer Live Chat available, although Dr. Victor Hurley the Falcon Project Manager has a Facebook page.

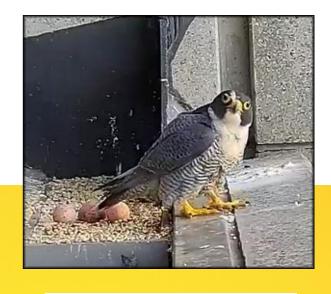
