July 14th, 2023 - Guest Speaker - Chris Callinan - Black Dog Institute

On Monday July 24th we heard from Chris Callinan, a volunteer with the Black Dog Institute.

I was a teacher in both Primary & Secondary Catholic Schools for 42 years, & my last position was Head of Wellbeing in a school of 2000 students. I've been retired for the past 5 years. My two key beliefs:

#'You never know what's happening in someone else's life'

'Only worry about the things you can change'

About Black Dog Institute

Science. Compassion. Action.

1 in 5 of us will experience symptoms of mental illness in any given year. In Australia that's around 5 million people. And roughly 60% of these people won't seek help.

Black Dog Institute, as the only medical research institute in Australia to investigate mental health across the lifespan, aims to create a mentally healthier world for everyone.

We do this through 'translational' research. Integrating our research studies, education programs, digital tools and apps, clinical services, and public resources to discover new solutions, foster connections and create real-world change.

Chris told us about his large family and how he was able to survive a period of severe depression through their amazing support. He also credits his counsellor, his doctor and his teenage daughter for whom he was able to take a Consistent, caring, routine role, taking her and collecting her from school, talking in the car. He thought that formula worked to help him heal. He now helps others going through similar issues.

Chris's brother is <u>Damian Callinan</u>, actor and comedian, star of The Merger.





Guided tour: Lindsay Fox Car Museum, Docklands

We've organised a club visit for a guided tour of the Lindsay Fox Car Museum in Docklands. The tour starts at 11am sharp Thursday August 31, followed by an optional lunch nearby. We'll organise car and Uber pooling, as public transport to Docklands is somewhat awkward.

The museum ticket admission is \$17, or \$10 concession. Kids \$6. The museum has a free car park, but cars can't stay there when the tour finishes. So, if you don't want lunch, you can drive there conveniently.


The Fox Classic Car Collection, housed in the historic Queen's Warehouse, contains dozens of the world's most rare and prestigious vehicles.

These cars have been collected over a 50-year period by Lindsay Fox, Founder of Australian logistics company Linfox, and donated to a Trust to raise funds for charity and for the public to enjoy. Lindsay has a passion for classic vehicles, with his collection including models from Mercedes Benz, Jaguar, Porsche, Ferrari, Bentley, Volkswagen, Ford, Rolls Royce, MG, Lexus and Nissan between 1923 and 2020.

Some vehicles have previously been owned by Ringo Starr, Bing Crosby and Bob Jane to name a few.

The collection is steeped in history, one-off prototypes, and cars that dreams are made of. Book <u>Here.</u>




