Population: 55 Location: Elcho Island, 40 km north of

Galiwin'ku township.

Building: Built in 2002, The Potter Foundation and Rotary.

Needs: The Elders have stated the need for a permanent teacher to be based at Donydji since the early 1970's.

Notes: This school building was constructed in 2002 with assistance from the Potter Foundation and Rotary. The Donydji families had been waiting over 30 years for a school building; the first classes were held under a tree in 1968.

Project W Water for Education brings clean, safe drinking water to high schools

Impact – Provide health, hygiene and environmentally sustainable solutions

Location – 57 out of 90 high schools in rural Siem Reap province do not have clean drinking water

Financial - The water filtration system is designed to last up to 10 years & is locally maintained. At

an average cost of AUD\$7,500 per school, the cost of providing clean water for every beneficiary is about AUD\$0.50 per year

Community – Meaningful sustainable impact on the lives of nearby communities with improved health, increased school attendance and cleaner environment

Inspiration – Education is key to changing lives, empowering the next generation through education, clean water for better health and a clean environment for better living conditions, will leave a lasting impact

40,000 students & 20,000 families




Annie's grandchildren have been homeschooling during Lockdown 6.0.
