### Fundraising has recommenced

A successful Bunnings BBQ has already taken place and raised over \$1,000 and another is scheduled for tomorrow. Despite the additional staffing roles required by Bunnings there was no problem in oversubscribing the roster. Again, we will be 'parking helpers' at Milleara Mall from Monday onwards. Gerard advised that were still come gaps in this roster so please offer to help if you can. We were also the recipient of a \$500 CommBank Community donation from their Niddrie branch (we were 'nominated' for the donation by the family of recent RYLA graduate and 'chair yoga' facilitator, Poppy). Details of how this will be used are in the Board Report which follows.




### **Board Report**

The Board has met since my last email to you all and I hope that my distribution list is now 100% accurate. I need to publicly apologise to members who at varying stages somehow came off the list or had never been successfully added to it despite by best, but obviously inadequate, efforts. The following decisions of the Board are relevant:

- All District 9800 'minimum' policies that we were asked to review have now been endorsed. They relate to areas of avoidance of harassment, protection of privacy, guidelines for media use and the protection of young people and other vulnerable groups. Copies have been distributed to you previously and the Protection Policy as amended by the Board will form the basis of a brief presentation to a future club meeting.
- Two donations for people in 'necessitous circumstances' were approved. One was for to meet a six month furniture storage expense of a single father now residing at Ronald McDonald House while supporting his 3 yo son in intensive care at RCH after extensive brain surgery following a series of aneurysms/strokes. The other is for a contribution to non-PBS (and therefore very expensive) breast cancer treatment for a former RC Brimbank Central member whose cancer was discovered during the early stages of her pregnancy with her fourth child, leading to a delay in the commencement of her treatment. The Commbank Community donation will be forwarded to assist these medical expenses.
- Packet will submit its application for a District Foundation funding for the 'four-school pilot' CRST Sky Hydrant water Project by 31 December 2020. This 'early' submission maximizes the chance of receiving the \$1 for every \$2 raised or pledged to the project up to a maximum grant of \$6000. This time constraint required us to act as 'guarantor' for \$6k of the project funding on the application form. Those associated with the grant application reasonably expect that the guarantee will not be necessary as other Clubs will join the project in the new year after receiving presentations about it and at least three individuals in the Club have already indicated that they would give significant personal donations if required. Additionally, the Club is already committed through its recently endorsed Funds Distribution Guidelines to allocating 25% of funds raised towards International Projects each year. Nevertheless, the Board will revisit and review the Project's funding progress in March/April 2021.
- Endorsement was given for funding half the cost of a memorial plaque for the inaugural St Albans SC Interact Club President who died tragically earlier this year.
- STOP PRESS: Our application for a District Foundation Scholarship (year 11&12) for a St Albans SC student has just been advised as successful.

### Western Emergency Relief Network update:

At WERN's AGM held on Tuesday 24 November, the Financial Report that was presented showed that WERN currently has equity of \$585k, due mainly to a very substantial 'ex gratia' payment from VicTrack that was given at the time it required WERN to vacate its Footscray warehouse early. WERN's Board then began consideration about using that payment to partly pay for the purchase of a warehouse but the opportunity of a joint venture between WERN and the City of Melton for the construction of a greenfield purpose-built facility in Ravenhall (twice the size of the current Derrimut temporary warehouse being rented) at 'peppercorn' rental and a 20-year lease subsequently emerged. That proposal is now awaiting final execution and will require a \$450k contribution from WERN. Construction completion is expected in early 2022 and WERN has sufficient equity to remain cash flow positive until the occupation of the planned new warehouse. In the interim, however, the current temporary premises in Derrimut were sold, consequently necessitating another relocation by WERN. Temporary premises have been found, also in Ravenhall, at a very favourable rent and the move has just been completed.






















## International - Daysies Update



### A message from Jane Odgers

**Hello Daysies** 

Happy New Year. We are so looking forward to finally getting back on track next month and seeing all your smiling faces. Here's hoping we'll all stay well and COVID-19 stays under control so that we can resume our lives, albeit in a somewhat modified form.

Recently while in Queensland I had the pleasure of finally meeting Michele Rankin who we work with in Balibo. Hopefully while she is still in Australia Michele may be able to join us at a sewing day. Michele and I had a general chat about DfG, and more specifically about what is needed for the Sewing Centre we are establishing and the Community Health Centre to which it is attached. Below is a list of items that she would love you to start collecting. Some I have mentioned before, but others are new to the list. Please either let me know if you have items or bring them along to sewing days.

- Baby knits and warm clothes (in excellent condition) size 00000 0
- Old towels washed and uncut these will be cut in Balibo to be turned into baby wraps
- Face washers (new or as new)
- Art supplies paints, pencils, brushes, canvases, art models (the small wooden movable figures artists use to help them draw people in motion), art easels
- Candle holders as power is either unavailable or unreliable. Op shops might be useful for this.

As you are aware, we ship our kits to Balibo from Donations in Kind in West Footscray. The containers they are packed in arrive in Dili. Once there someone from Balibo makes the long return trip to Dili to collect them and take them back to the Community Centre.

Unfortunately, the van used for these trips, and others associated with the Centre and dental clinic, has passed its use by date. Balibo House Trust is now raising money to try to replace this essential bit of equipment. Below is the email detailing how to donate should you like to help.

Dear Friends and Colleagues,

Many of you know of the fabulous work that our dental clinic does in the Balibo Sub-District of Timor Leste, in a country where there are less than 10 public dentists for over 1 million people. Through the work of our visiting volunteer Australian dentists and the two Timorese dental assistants we employ, we have been able to treat serious tooth decay and gum disease as well as run a dental health promotion program with children in the district schools and kindergartens.

Unfortunately, our Trusty Toyota, so vital to our outreach work, is on its last legs. We are fundraising to purchase another vehicle so our dental assistants can visit remote schools, our education mentor can continue to support and develop the skills of more teachers and we can deliver Days for Girls kits to more young women. Please help us reach them.

Our goal is to raise a minimum of \$25,000.

Spread the joy of Christmas to our friends in Timor Leste. Please pass onto your friends.




