- a. Italian migrants from Province of Vibo Valentia [then named Catanzaro], Calabria in Southern Italy.
- b. Raised in the Catholic [Christian] life values.
- c. The Cichello family history originates from town called Zungri in the same Province.
- d. The area is rich in its early culture and has very colourful folklore festa's and parades annually in august.
- e. Refer to the Zungri Commune caves early settlement which is a now tourist point of interest.
- 3. My life was cast for me in my childhood.
- a. Migrant parents adopting a new land to call home didn't give me much option for a

childhood.

- b. The family needed to be a part of the new society and so no scope for idle play.
- 4. My place of birth.
- a. I was born at Bairnsdale district Hospital
- 5. My parents instilled the adventurer "No Limits" spirit in me.
- 6. My preschool days.
- 7. My early school days and its handicaps.
- 8. Sacrifices made for basic education.
- 9. My education and my choices.
- 10. My teenage decision to discontinue education.
- 11. Offered a football scholarship by South Melbourne Football Club 1967.
- 12. Introduction to aboriginal [first nation] life, survivals and cultures, via school association and farm employment.
- 13. Played Basketball with the Lake Tyres aboriginal team in East Gippsland League 1970.
- 14. Working on the family farm from age 16-20 years.
- 15. Community service with Apex of Lakes Entrance; Secretary at 18 years of age.
- 16. I also worked at Lakes Entrance Fisherman's Cooperative for approx. one year.
- 17. Attempts to study accountancy "off campus", very challenging whilst working on a farm.
- 18. National Service Duty [A National Disaster]

19. Post National Service [The black hole]. No farm operation left to return to; so took option to study leaving/orientation year.

20. Back to studies to up skill and studied Higher Technician Certificate.
