Fellow RCKE Rotarians



NEXT CLUB MEETING:

We are scheduled to meet again next Monday (1 February) and we will be reconvening back at KERSL for that meeting at our usual time. As I advised those attending the Bike Centre ten days ago, there was some unease expressed by both Board Directors and Club members about the adequacy of the implementation of a socially-distant COVID-safe Plan at KERSL during our December gathering and, following our Board meeting earlier this week, Joe Albioli has just advised me that he has met and discussed those concerns with KERSL management and been given reassurance about the adequacy of their arrangements for our return to KERSL. Next Monday's meeting content will be 'traditional' in the sense that there will be meals, Reports, and fellowship etc. but instead of an external guest speaker we will have the opportunity to hear from our own members whose 'essential service' vocations have seen them continue working with the public during the pandemic. They will each have 3-5 mins to share that experience with us.



BOARD MEETING held on MONDAY 25 JANUARY 2021:

Items of business at this meeting, other than updates given in Director's specific portfolio reports, were as follow:

- 1. Out of an abundance of caution until vaccination programs have become a reality for all of the community, we would maintain our current fortnightly meeting pattern but only in a manner which implements COVID-safe practices. We remain alert to the possibility that, at some stage in 2021, we may again need to revert to Zoom meetings, alternative 'in person' venues or a hybrid of both.
- 2. A suggestion about purchasing a new set of BBQ aprons for those working at our Bunnings BBQs etc. led to an impromptu review of our 'BBQ marketing' strategy. Considered in that review were the following:
- that the set of 12 RCKE branded aprons purchased by RCKE a few years ago needs to be located;
- that having a variety of marketing sources which include our brand/logo/name will showcase Rotary as a professional and worthwhile community service organisation and have the potential to attract new members;
- that there are already sandwich boards available in the Club which can be covered with corflutes detailing some of the community projects that we support and fund;
- that there are also 'tear drop' flag poles available which, with either the addition or replacement of RCKE club name on the flag, could be displayed at our BBQs
- 3. The issue of managing and storing our Club 'assets' in a central and accessible location was also addressed. Phil had first started work on this challenge about a year ago and has done some research about possible solutions. 'Commercial' solutions would be quite expensive, so he is suggesting that we attempt to think of 'freebie' options or options which only have an initial set up cost rather than being an ongoing 'rental' expense for the Club. In the near future, Phil will be sending an email to all Club members about the asset stocktake that is needed as well as canvassing possible storage options, so please give some thought now to where or with whom such options may exist.
- 4. Our major fundraiser, the Moonee Valley Art Show (to be held May 14-16), will be upon us before we know so now is the time to be seeking New Sponsors for the event. While we are aware that many businesses have been greatly challenged by the pandemic, we are also aware that there are some industries and businesses (eg financial planning, grocery and liquor retail to name a couple) that have done quite well. Also please think about any businesses within your sphere of influence that could have done well during 2020 and who could be approached as sponsors.
- 5. There may exist a possibility of a joint environmentally-themed project with RC Essendon related to the local Men's Shed constructing beehives for community placement.

I look forward to seeing many of you at KERSL on Monday.
