SPRINGTIME FRUIT SALAD

1½ cups cold vanilla custard, medium thick

1 cup cream

½ cup sweet sherry or marsala (I used marsala as it is lighter in flavour)

125 gm glace cherries

125 gm can mandarin segments

455 gm can pineapple pieces

125 gm marshmallows (I used pink & white mini marshmallows)

Drain the pineapple and mandarin segments. Add sherry or marsala to custard. Beat the cream stiffly and fold into the custard and sherry mixture. Cut the cherries in half and the marshmallows into quarters and add to the custard mixture, together with the pineapple and mandarin. I also added some green grapes.

Leave in refrigerator for 3 to 4 hours before serving.


