Rotarian Behind the Badge – Marisa Sanna – **My Life as an Educator** Monday 22nd January - Notes by Chris Rundell



36 years in the class room – 32 years at Pascoe Vale Secondary College.

Started teaching career at Mildura Secondary College then Sunshine West High School. Love kids - and is still involved. Tutored 7 students last year.

Born in Queensland, Marisa's mother taught her that education was very important and did not want to stay in Inglewood QLD - wanted to move down to Melbourne as education opportunities were much better (Marisa's parents emigrated from Italy).

Career started in 1980 - overnight rail trip to Mildura. People there were just beautiful. Established teaching of Italian in Mildura. Also started teaching Italian to adults. After 1 year at Mildura she went down to Melbourne and got married. In 1981 taught at Sunshine West High school. Learnt about disadvantaged students. Have been reading Les Twentyman's memoir. In 1984 stared at Pascoe Vale Girls College and was there for 32 years. Different type of students.

She believes that we are basically all the same – it's our environment that makes us different. Naughty students - loved them. They misbehaved for a reason.

In addition to being a class room teacher, she was also Year 11 Co-ordinator and Co-ordinator of LOTE (languages other than English).

Loved seeing the progress that students made, and also seeing them later on in life. Recently went to a past student's 21st birthday. She was 6 months out of hospital after suffering anorexia. Makes teaching worth it.

Annoyances - Government changes, Blackburn Report and Curriculum Frameworks. Have been retired for just over a year. Don't miss it. Have a lot of empathy for graduates who often have to take up short term contracts.

Other activities: Do some knitting for RCH. Go to the gym and the movies. Looking forward to spending time at Rotary.


