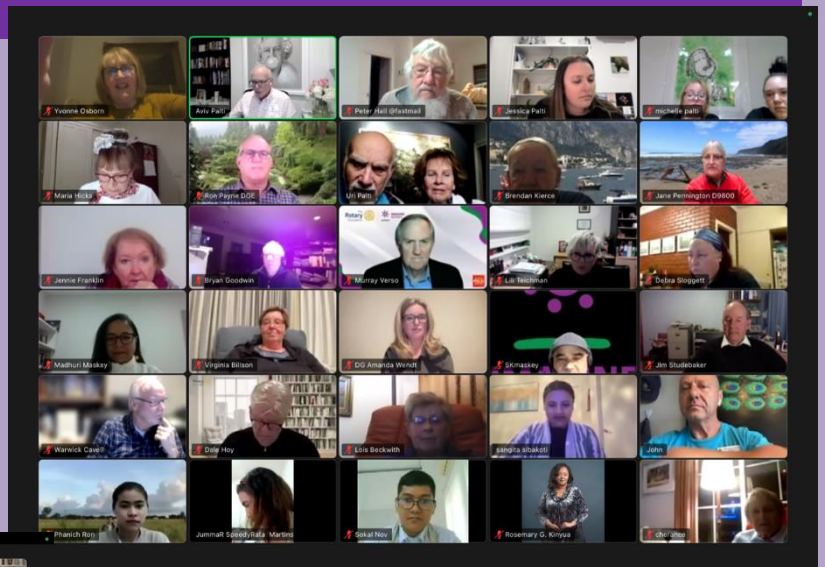

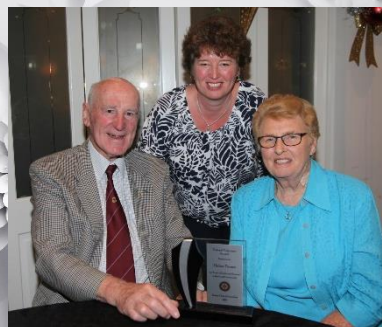
Deb Sloggett with her friend who purchased the painting "After The Rain, Mont Matre" by Angelo Quabba.
