## Airport West Knitting Group



### Guest Speaker - Celia Rice - Moonee Valley Libraries - Monday 9th June







This year the Essendon Library celebrates 50 years of operation. It initially consisted of the Flemington and Essendon branches but now has many others including the Keilor Branch ( in Niddrie) and Avondale Heights. The Essendon Library is now called the Sam Merrifield Library. The Libraries have 58,000 members.

In this technological age many other forms of media are offered as well as traditional printed books. Free computer access is available to all residents as well as free wi-fi access within the Library buildings.


Programs which can be quite expensive to access personally such as <u>Ancestry</u>, <u>Studiosity</u> and other online courses such as <u>Lynda</u> are freely available.

Programs such as <u>Early Literacy Support</u> are offered to children and their families. Books are given to each new baby in the municipality. Families are encouraged to participate in the <u>1000 Books Program</u>.

The Libraries are community buildings for the benefit of all residents. There are special school holiday programs, Family History and craft groups. Meeting rooms are available for use by community groups.

Special occasions are celebrated e.g. Book Week, Biggest Morning Tea, Melbourne Food and Wine Festival, Melbourne Fringe Festival, Melbourne Writers Group. There are Author Talks, IT Classes, English Language and Conversation Classes, Memoir Writing. All upcoming activities are in the What's On brochures or on the website.


