### GUEST SPEAKER - SHAUN AISEN - ANGEL FLIGHT



- Shaun Aisen began by explaining that Angel Flight is a group of volunteer pilots and ground angels who provide a service for rural Australians who don't qualify for the Governments Air Ambulance services.
- They endeavour to provide same day service so that accommodation costs are avoided.
- Angel Flight has operated over 22,000 individual flights. There are 3000 pilots. Shan has flown over 430 services. He doesn't currently own a plane so he hires one and pays for the fuel. Pilots donate their time, plane hire and any fees incurred.
- Having had a colon cancer himself Shaun understands how taxing treatment can be even when the stress of being so far from a treatment facility is
  removed.
- He has become friends with many patients over the years. He has transported one lady from Albury eighty times.
- He finds there are many more positives than negatives to the role of volunteer.
- There are 3000 ground volunteers. Information can be found on the Angel Flight website. <u>www.angelflight.org.au</u>.
- The volunteer pilots and Ground Angels take the patient and supporters e.g. parents.
- They provide non emergency services only. They take no organs for transplant and only operate fixed wing services using private aircraft.
- The main metropolitan Airports used are Essendon, Lilydale, Moorabbin and Point Cook.
- Shaun thanked our Club for having him relay his Angel Flight message and asked that we spread the word about its service and volunteering opportunities. Chairperson Ken Allan gave Shaun a gift as a token of our appreciation for his excellent presentation.

Shaun's flights have covered thousands of kilometres.
