#### Guest Speaker Monday 30th May - Milly Burke

Milly Burke is a member of Parks and Gardens Department of Moonee Valley City Council MVCC, in the Conservation Team. She has been at Council since 2018 and is the Conservation Programs Officer. She works with community groups to connect the Moonee Valley Community to nature.

She will spoke on the work the Conservation team does and some of the key strategies they are working on. She talked about the way she works on community engagement in biodiversity. I trained as a Primary Teacher at Bendigo and Coburg Teacher Colleges and taught for 44 years.

THE deaths of two family members inspired Channel 7 news reporter Kate Jones and her father, Greg Osborn, to literally run for their lives.

Mr Osborn, who once tipped the scales at 130kg, made a lifesty le change at the age of 58 in order to avoid the fatte of his father and brother, who each died aged 60.

"I decided to change my life completely. When my weight got down to about 115kg 1 started to run; 50 m was all 1 could do, but 1 persevered getting up to a 2.5km circuit of the block," Mr Osborn, 64, said.





We have enjoyed taking them on our travels within Australia. We took Rayssa to the UK and to China in 2019 as she was coming back to Australia for veterinary work experience.


I believe that we can enrich the lives of these students by hosting them but that our lives are enriched much more by the sharing of experiences and by understanding of their different cultures.






