Members who attended our Progressive Dinner had an enjoyable meal and a great opportunity to catch up with each other as well as receiving a horse in our free Cup Sweep.



### Climate action and biodiversity

Greenfleet – implementing climate action by restoring ecosystems

25 year old NGO - 16 staff – 600 forests across Australia and NZ sequestering 3.5m+ tonnes of eCO2 - over 9m trees planted - support from 1000s of individuals and







- · Greenfleet and Bush Heritage Australia are working together to protect threatened eco systems in central
- · In recent years, the Nardoo Hills Reserve has seen the dieback of multiple Eucalypt species. This has been attributed to a changing climate.
- The seeds being planted are from Eucalypt species in hotter climates with the goal to future proof the region's trees, as temperatures continue to rise.
- · The work by Greenfleet began in early 2019. The land has been ripped in preparation for planting set to take place in winter this year.
- · The research part of this project has been undertaken with help from multiple organisations including the University of Melbourne, CSIRO, the University of Adelaide and the University of









- · Greenfleet's Low Glow project is a unique environmental and community engagement initiative in Bundaberg, Queensland.
- The project received international attention when HRH The Prince of Wales met with the project partners in April 2018.
- Greenfleet has planted over 85,000 native trees at Barolin Nature Reserve, and has assisted with initiatives including a pilot community lighting audit.
- · As the trees grow, they will provide a 'green curtain' to shield the endangered sea turtle population at Mon Repos beach from artificial light pollution.
- · Light glow from towns and cities lures turtle hatchings away from the safety of the sea.







## **Guest Speaker - Wayne Westcott - CEO Greenfleet**

### Monday 25th October 2021

- Greenfleet, Telstra and Kowanyama Aboriginal Shire Council joined forces to plant over 1,000 native and fruit trees in Kowanyama, Queensland.
- The project will deliver a wide range of environmental, health and well-being benefits for the local community.
- Native trees will protect the climate and environment, and reverse the damage caused by Cyclone Nora in 2018.
- Fruit-bearing trees will create a source of fresh fruit for the local community.
- Community planting event on World Environment Day 2018; over 100 students from Kowanyama State School and RISE Ventures' youth program.







### Noosa Project

- · Kabi Kabi
- The traditional owners of the land are key partners in the project, who have an active native title claim to an area encompassing the Yurol and Ringtail state forests
- Native title filed by 7 key proponents on behalf of a larger community of ~1,000 people
- The claim covers approximately 11,700 sq km including Noosa and the Sunshine cost
- Excludes Crown freehold grants, specific leases (e.g. boat, housing, rail, grazing) as well as certain specific areas
- The claim encompasses the Yurol and Ringtail State Forests
- Seeking access to carbon rights associated with the areas of reforestation undertaken by Greenfleet infers a future use of the land
- Consequently an Indigenous Land Use Agreement (ILUA) with the Kabi Kabi people was required
- I signed this in May 2021

### A Social Catch Up and an introduction to Kahoot Trivia





Kahoot! is a game-based learning platform, used as educational technology in schools and other educational institutions. Its learning games, "kahoots", are user-generated multiple-choice quizzes that can be accessed via a web browser or the Kahoot app. Kahoot! is a tool for using technology to administer quizzes, Multiple-choice questions are projected on the screen. Participants/Students answer the questions with their smartphone, tablet or computer. The Kahoot app download is available for iOS (iPad and iPhone) and for Android devices as well as on desktop (PCs, laptops and Mac computers). Kahoot is free to download.



#### **HOME HOSTING OPPORTUNITIES**

Rotarians who are registered for the Convention and live within an approximate 15 km radius of the CBD can apply to host between 4 and 8 international and interstate guests in their home for dinner. Priority for hosting will be given to Registered Convention attendees but non-attendee Rotarians are also welcome to apply.

As a Home Host you will be responsible for arranging transport for your guests to and from your home. You may want to consider involving others in your Club, or immediate family to assist in this process. It is acceptable to have guests returned to their hotels by Taxi or Uber.

Hosts will receive \$55 per guest (from the registration fee for this event) to help offset the costs of the dinner and transport.




### **CLUB HOSTING OPPORTUNTIES**

These ever-popular Convention events fill quickly and we expect that Melbourne won't be any different. Clubs or a group of Clubs are invited to design their own event and dinner which can be at the same venue or two different venues. To minimise travel time venues should be within a 20 km radius of the CBD. Guests are picked up by bus from their hotel and once onboard, an announcement about their destination is provided. *Surprise!* Clubs will need to host guests in multiples of 50 (one busload) and have at least 5-10 hosting Rotarians & partners for each group of 50 at the dinner venue.

Delegates registering for Host Hospitality will pay a flat charge to attend which will include their return bus trip. Clubs will receive a contribution of \$35pp towards the catering costs. Drinks will need to be purchased on a cash basis at the bar. Clubs should consider budgeting separately for any additional catering costs or entertainment. 
