Foodbank Victoria is an independent not-for-profit organization with more than 80 years' food relief experience. It is the state's oldest and largest organization its kind. It was established in 1930, in the Depression years and is now based at a large warehouse at 4/2 Somerville Road, Yarraville. The goal of Foodbank is to source and distribute the healthy food required for all people in Victoria to be food secure. Sadly, for instance, one in seven children in Victoria go to school without breakfast and one in ten people don't know where their next meal is coming from.

Each month Foodbank provides food for over 134,000 people, including 34,000 children.

Warehouse volunteering – Each weekday, a number of Foodbank's regular volunteers are assisted by a group of corporate volunteers to pick and pack orders placed by their 451 welfare and charity partners. In addition to picking orders, warehouse volunteers may also be required to do other tasks such as sorting food and packing emergency relief hampers.

Foodbank supplies <u>School Breakfast Clubs</u> which are also in need of volunteers.

Community Groups such as Rotary, CWA, Lions etc. and workplaces can organize <u>Food Drives</u> to assist Foodbank in collecting staple items.

The chairperson for the evening, Past President Joe Albioli, thanked Carli for her informative presentation and gave her our presentation memory stick as a token of our appreciation.


