President's Report

Monday 24th September 2018





- President Ginny Billson has spent the past week in hospital. We hope she will be well rested
- and back with us soon. Ginny sent us the link to the photograph from her RANZCOG Services to Women's Health Award. We are very proud of our multi-talented President and send her our heartiest congratulations.



For those Members and friends of the Club who might be unfamiliar with Ginny's work prior to her retirement from The Women's Hospital here is a snapshot.

Dr Virginia Billson (Ginny) worked as a pathologist at The Women's Hospital for fifteen years and nine months prior to her retirement in March 2018.

She is part of the Consultative Council on Obstetric and Paediatric Mortality and Morbidity (CCOPMM), the advisory body to the Minister for Health on maternal, perinatal and paediatric mortality and morbidity.

Ginny has previously described her job as being like a detective, trying to discover the cause of infant deaths. Sadly, some babies die before birth and some not long after birth. It was Ginny and her team's responsibility to provide answers as to why this happens. Some are caused by genetic abnormalities, others by e.g. placental abnormalities, prematurity and infections. The Women's website offers this explanation -

The post mortem examination aims to find out as much as possible about why the baby died. A specialist pathologist does the examination and even though the baby is deceased, the pathologist is trained to treat the baby as they would treat anyone having an operation, with respect and care.

Ginny's career has been one of specializing in the pathology involved in maternal, perinatal and paediatric mortality and morbidity. We congratulate Ginny upon her long commitment to research and discovery in these sensitive areas and upon receiving the prestigious Services to Women's Health Award.



"On Monday 24th September our Guest Speakers were Gavin Wignall (Secretary) and Geoff Nicholl (President) from East Keilor Football Club. They told us of their voluntary involvement with the Club over many years and of the changes they have seen in football grounds, uniforms, facilities, local council contributions and community participation. They showed us plans of their proposed \$3.9 million Overland facilities rebuild which will also cater for the introduction of women's teams and move the East Keilor Cougars into the future."

Established in 1967 the Club played a few games at Pavilions Estate before moving to Overland Reserve where brown brick change rooms and a canteen were built for \$27,000. After extensions in 1989 -1990 the Club has managed to survive using volunteer labour and receiving local government grants which always seemed less than required.

Gavin Wignall has a transport business and Geoff Nicholl is a builder. They are volunteers in their community. Geoff reluctantly took up the role as Club President in 2012. The East Keilor Football Club celebrated 50 years in 2017. Their Under 19 team has just won a Premiership. Membership has exploded with new girls teams being formed over the past year. The Club tries to keep the yearly membership fees down for its young players. They are currently around \$350 compared to around \$700 at bigger clubs in the League.

There is a lot of fundraising to do so that the Club consolidates and grows. The Club is very grateful to the AFL for a \$100,000 donation. After much negotiating over several years the facilities upgrade at Overland Reserve will provide state of the art facilities for the East Keilor Cougars. The old buildings will be demolished and the teams will operate from portable buildings while construction gets underway in May 2019.


Shine On Recognition - Nominations NOW OPEN

Does you club know of somebody with a disability?

Do they provide outstanding support to others with disability?

Are they a community leader or involved in a community group?

Do you have a relationship with a local organisation that supports people with disability who may want to nominate somebody for Shine On?



RI Southern Districts 'Shine On' is a multi-district project covering all of Victoria (and small parts of SA and NSW), and acknowledges exceptional service to others by people with disabilities. Clubs may nominate people who meet the criteria and all nominees will receive recognition with a Certificate of Commendation.

To be eligible, nominees should:

- Demonstrate the active involvement of the nominee in community service for the benefit of others and have demonstrated a significant level of personal achievement whilst managing a specific medical disorder/disability, and
- Be endorsed by Rotary Club.

Examples of personal achievement may include:

- Leadership and/or mentoring of others with the disability
- Membership and/or leadership in community groups
- Service to the community and/or a history of community achievement
- Other special awards or forms of recognition

Nominations may be made anybody in the community, and, are open to people aged over 15 years.

Each Nomination must be endorsed by a Rotary club. The nominee must sign a consent form and include a small or passport sized photo, as well as other supporting documentation.

Nominations close on 15 December 2018.

The Shine On Recognition ceremony will take place on Sunday 7 May 2019 at the Italian Sports Club of Werribee, hosted by the Rotary Club of Hoppers Crossing.
